History

In 1988, the Andre House created St. Joseph the Worker (SJW) in response to a humble plea from homeless individuals receiving dinner in the park: "We want jobs, but we don't have the tools." Since then, SJW has focused solely on empowering men and women who are "down and out" to transform their lives through employment. SJW is a non-profit organization that is 100% privately funded.



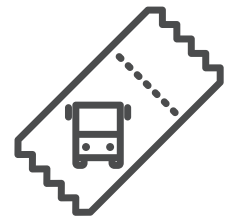

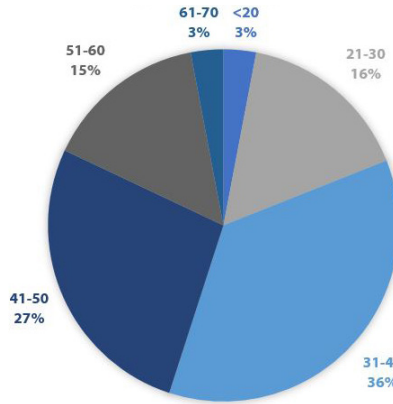

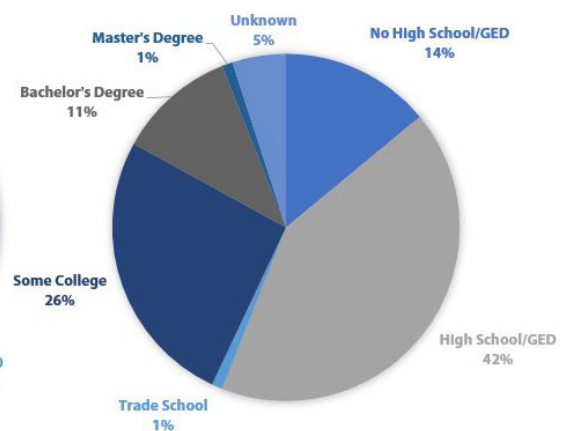
The average starting wage for full-time employment was **\$12.73**

CLIENT SERVICES

Job Readiness

Clients receive help with preparing resumes and job applications, mock interviews, personal presentation and communication tips, coaching on how to effectively explain a criminal history or large gap in employment, and building confidence.

Resources

Clients are given an address and phone number for professional correspondence; internet access to job search and submit applications; clothing that is clean, neat, and professional; basic hygiene items; and daily bus passes to ensure transportation to and from interviews.

Ongoing Support After Employment

Reduced monthly bus passes to ensure transportation, financial assistance to pay for work uniforms, footwear, or tools, help covering certification or license fees, and assistance for individuals in low-income or part-time employment in locating a higher paying job.

SJW recognizes that not everyone needs all services. Clients work closely with their Employment Specialist to determine what level of service is right for them.
